SCHEDULE 2

**PROHIBITION OF DRIVING OF ALL MOTOR VEHICLES EXCEPT IN A
NORTHERLY DIRECTION (ONE WAY NORTHBOUND)**

STEPNEY ROAD, WAUNARLWYDD

From its junction with Victoria Road to its junction with Swansea Road.

SCHEDULE 3

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

ROSELAND ROAD, WAUNARLWYDD

North West side – from a point 128 metres north of its junction with the northern kerbline of Swansea Road northwards for a distance of 21 metres (to tunnel wall) and

North East side – from a point 76 metres north of its junction with the northern kerbline of Swansea Road northwards for a distance of 74 metres (to tunnel wall)

BRYN ROAD

On its north eastern side from its junction with the southern kerbline of Victoria Road south eastwards for a distance of 60 metres and

On its south western side from its junction with the southern kerblines of Victoria Road south eastwards for a distance of 55 metres.

SWANSEA ROAD

On its western side from its junction with the northern kerb line of Victoria Road northwards for a distance of 14 metres and on its eastern side from its junction with the northern kerb line of Victoria Road northwards for a distance of 15 metres.

VICTORIA ROAD

On its northern side from a point 25 metres west of the western kerb line of Swansea Road eastwards to a point 6 metres east of the eastern kerblines of Swansea Road.

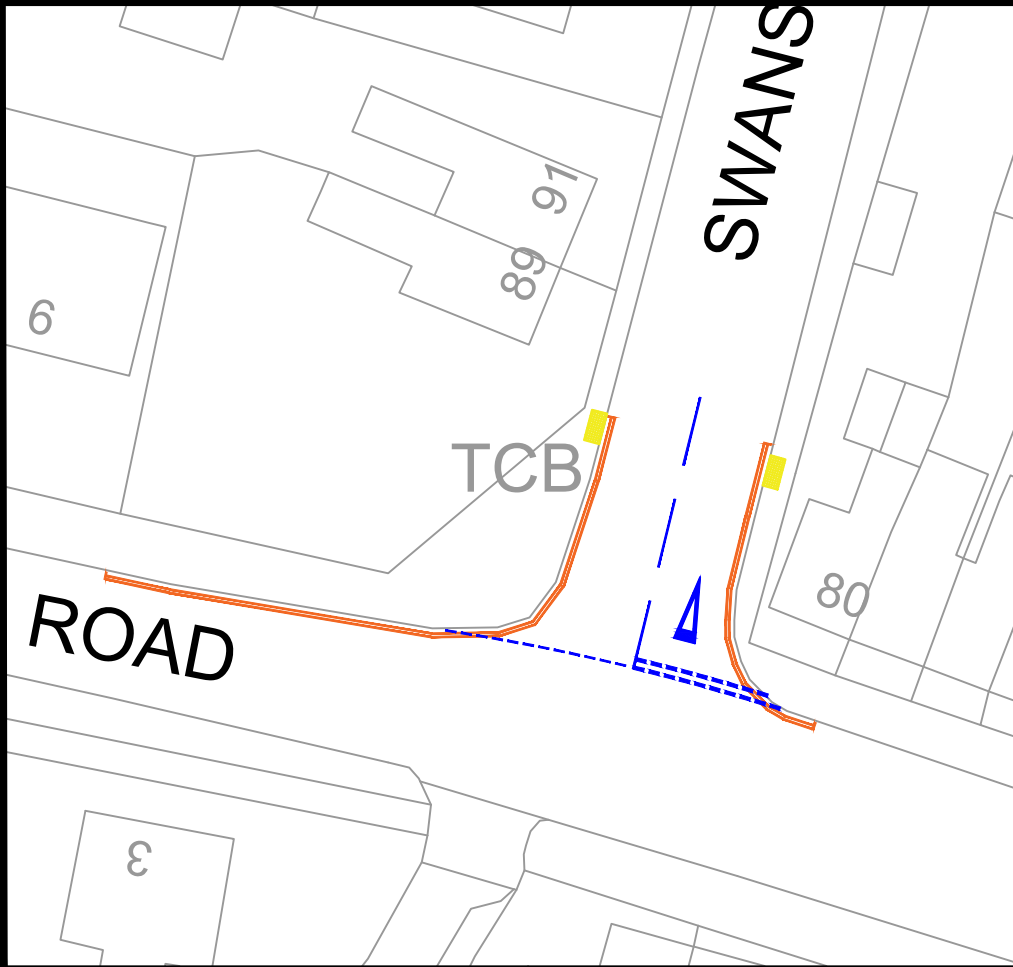
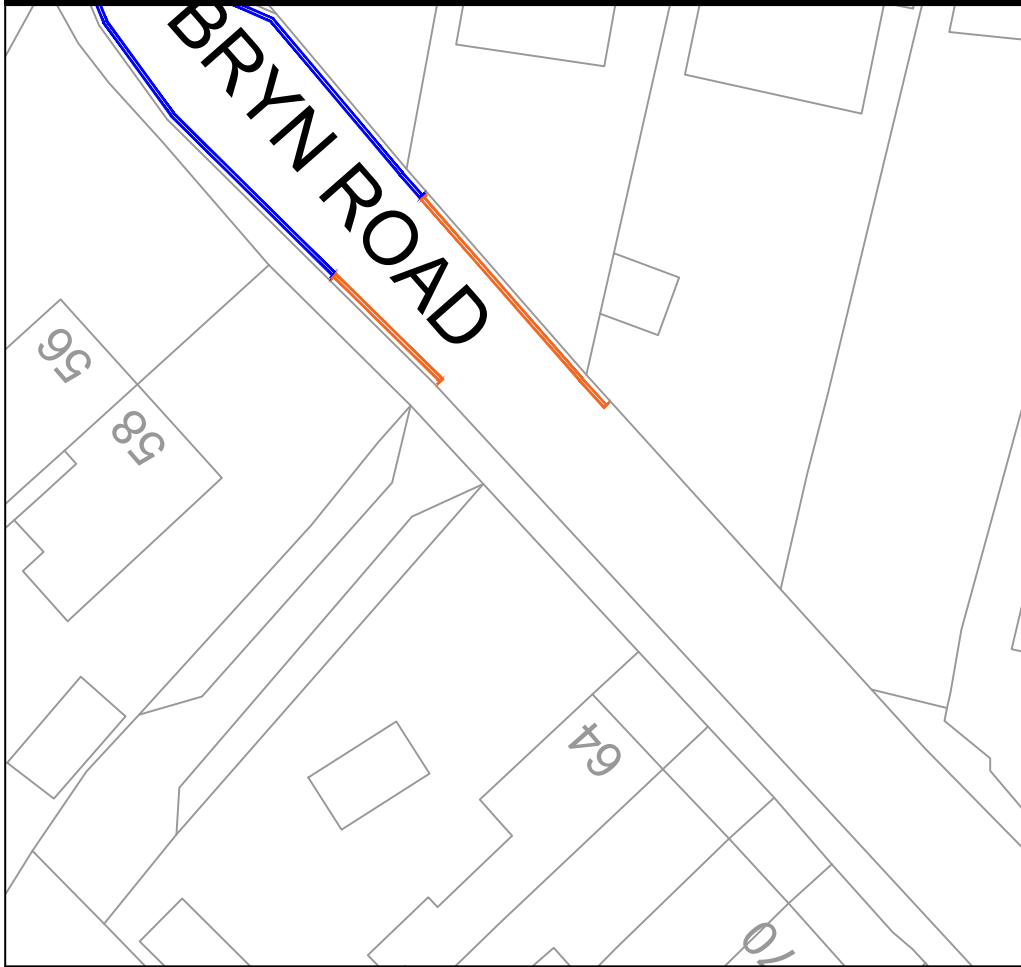

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Notice of Intent for the Traffic Regulation Order

STEPNEY ROAD & ROSELAND ROAD.

WAUNARLWYDD

In Roseland Road, the provision of double yellow lines are for the purpose of promoting road safety in the vicinity of a school and outside a sports venue

In Stepney Road, the provision of 'one way' operation is for the purpose of promoting road safety.

Extract from RTRA 1984

2 What a traffic regulation order may provide.

(1) A traffic regulation order may make any provision prohibiting, restricting or regulating the use of a road, or of any part of the width of a road, by vehicular traffic, or by vehicular traffic of any class specified in the order,—

(a) either generally or subject to such exceptions as may be specified in the order or determined in a manner provided for by it, and

(b) subject to such exceptions as may be so specified or determined, either at all times or at times, on days or during periods so specified.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called “the Council”) in exercise of its powers under Sections the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”) and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

SECTION 1 – PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

1. This Order shall come into operation on xx xxxxx 2023 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of Swansea, Wuanarlwydd Ward Stepney Road and Roseland Road Prohibition of Driving and Waiting Restrictions, Order 2023

Definitions

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

“bus” shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981;

“civil enforcement officer” has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act of 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a civil enforcement officer appointed under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 is a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contraventions;

“exempted vehicles” means:

- (a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) ;(b) any Vehicles being used for naval, military or air force purposes, and being driven by a person for the time

being subject to the orders of the member of the armed forces of the crown, who is a member of the special forces-

- (i) in response, or for a practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds, or
- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

"public service vehicle" means a vehicle carrying passengers for a fee and for the purposes of this Order public service vehicle refers to a large public service vehicle capable of carrying more than eight passengers;

"relevant position" in respect of:-

- (a) a disabled person's badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000; and
- (b) a permit means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;
- (c) a pay and display ticket means exhibited on the windscreen dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the ticket is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;
- (d) a waiver means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the waiver is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"Virtual Parking Permit" means an electronic record of parking ticket, permit or dispensation issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction or to make payment other than on site covered in the provisions of this order, under the terms applicable at the time of issue. A Virtual Parking Permit may be obtained by any of the methods provided from time to time by the Council and to

be valid must be registered on an account in an electronic database approved by the Council with an indication that the permit has been issued and validated in accordance with Council procedures.

“waiver” means a waiver issued by the Council in respect of vehicles being used for building maintenance repair shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations and the Council may charge for such waiver such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or relevant Committee thereof;

Interpretation

3. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise
6. For the purposes of this Order each area of a length of highway specified in the schedule (or part thereof) which is delineated by a Traffic Sign or Signs placed in the vicinity of the Parking Place in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 or in accordance with s64 of the 1984 Act shall be designated as a Parking Place.

SECTION 2 - PROHIBITION OF DRIVING OF ALL MOTOR VEHICLES EXCEPT IN A NORTHERLY DIRECTION (ONE WAY NORTHBOUND)

7. Save as provided in Article 8 and except on the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a person authorised by the Council no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the direction as specified along the length or lengths of road or roads as referred to in Schedule 2 hereto

Exemption

8. Nothing in Article 7 shall apply to exempted vehicles.

SECTION 3 - NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

9. Save as provided in Articles 10 and 11 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 3 hereto.

Exemptions

10. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- a. the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - i. building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the relevant position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - iv. a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
- b. the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- c. the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail.
- d. public service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers
- e. vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers

11. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Persons Badge

and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting).

12. The existing Orders are revoked insofar as they are inconsistent with the proposals contained in the schedules hereto and insofar as they relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the Schedule hereto
