

The half mile (0.8km) nature trail begins at this point. Follow the path just behind you which will lead you to the first of ten information posts. This pleasant and varied walk will lead you from the playground area through to deciduous woodland. The path drops into the valley, alongside the Clyne River and then leads back uphill to an open grassy area.

Things to do on the Trail ...

Solve the word puzzle:



Collect the letters to make the name of a creature that you may spot on the Trail. Collect red letters to make a Welsh word or to create an English word collect the white letters.
CLUE: The creature is mentioned on one of the posts.



Make a rubbing:



Take a pad of paper and a pencil/crayon with you and at each post make a rubbing of the animal, plant or fungus on the post. When you get home you can arrange the rubbings you have collected to create your own nature food chain. Who eats whom?
