



A fascinating walk through a hidden valley

The ancient woodland cloaks a mysterious landscape of limestone caves, underground rivers and historic mine workings.

The trees are mostly mature ash and oak with a hazel understorey; the rare wild service tree and small-leaved lime can also be found. Ancient woodland indicator plants abound. The valley sides and floor are strewn with limestone boulders which can make for challenging walking but provide superb habitat for mosses and ferns.

Leading along the upper edge of the woodland, with good views over the canopy, the trail then drops to the emergence point of the underground river. Follow the valley floor upstream, passing the aptly - named Guzzle Hole - listen for the underground stream - and the huge collapsed cavern of Daw Pit before climbing the valley side back to the start point.
