



Once the private estate of John Dillwyn Llewelyn, the site is a mosaic of ancient woodland, Victorian plantings and modern forestry.

The route skirts the north end of the site then heads south through the aptly-named Bluebell Wood before descending a steep stream valley with splendid specimens of planted conifers. Follow the river through semi-natural ancient woodland crossing the first bridge (Sapper's Bridge) to gain a wide track which brings you (via a short detour) to the lower lake.

Back on the main track turn right just after power-lines up the slopes of Graig Neddfwch to a fine viewpoint over the varied woodland canopy. The route then descends to join the old Carriage Drive for the original mansion. Follow this until a small path drops steeply to the right to join the valley floor track leading past the waterfall and upper lake to complete the circuit.
