BYELAWS FOR THE REGULATION OF DOGS ON THE SEASHORE
AND THE PROMENADES



Byelaws made by the Council of the City of Swansea under *Section 82*
and Section 83 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1907 and Section 235
of the Local Government Act 1972 in respect of the seashore and
promenades.



EXTENT

(1) These byelaws apply to the beaches being ~~open~~ areas of the
seashore described in Schedule One, hereafter referred to as
'the beach' and includes any slope or staircase leading onto the
beach, and also to the promenades described in Schedule Two,
hereinafter referred to as "the promenades".



(2) Notice of the effect of these byelaws shall be given by signs
placed in conspicuous positions on the approaches to the beach and
the promenades.

INTERPRETATION

2 (1) In these byelaws:
"The Council" means the Council of the City of Swansea.

(2) For the purpose of these byelaws the keeper of the dog shall be
deemed in charge thereof, unless the Court is satisfied that at
the time when the dog entered or remained on the beach *it had*
been placed in or taken into the charge of some other person *of the promenades.*



(3) In paragraph (2) above, "the keeper" shall include the owner of
the dog or any person who habitually has it in his possession.

DOGS ON THE BEACH

3. Between 1st May and 30th September inclusive in any year, every
person in charge of a dog (other than a registered blind person
in charge of a dog) who without reasonable excuse permits the
dog to enter or remain on the beach shall be guilty of an
offence.



4. An Officer of the Council or any Constable may require a person
in charge of a dog which has entered the ~~dog prohibited~~ beach to
remove the dog from the beach.

DOGS ON LEADS

5. Between 1st May and 30th September inclusive in any year no person in charge of a dog shall, without reasonable excuse, permit the dog to enter or remain on the promenades unless the dog is held on a lead and is restrained from behaviour giving reasonable grounds for annoyance.




PENALTY

6. Any person offending against ~~any of these~~ ³⁰⁵ byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level two on the standard scale.

SAVING ON CROWN AND OTHER RIGHTS

7. Nothing contained in any of the foregoing Byelaws shall be deemed to be or shall operate as a grant by or on behalf of the Crown as owner of the seabed below low water mark or any estate or interest in or right over such seabed, or any part thereof, nor shall anything contained in or done under any of the provisions of the foregoing Byelaws in any respect prejudice or injuriously affect the rights and interests of the Crown in such seabed, or prevent the exercise thereon of any public rights or prejudice or injuriously affect any right, power or privilege legally exercisable by any person in, over and in respect of the seashore.

SCHEDULE ONE



The ~~dog prohibited~~ beaches referred to in Byelaw 1 (1) are:-

- (A) The area of Swansea Beach from the Western edge of the West Pier to the Eastern edge of the Slip opposite Swansea Municipal Swimming Baths.
- (B) The area of Beach known as Langland Bay including Rotherslade Bay.
- (C) The area of Beach known as Caswell Bay.



SCHEDULE TWO
"The promenades" referred to in byelaw (1) are as follows;

(A)

The Promenade at Swansea Bay from its commencement near the Observatory Tower, Swansea Marina, to the Slip at the Mumbles end of the Knab Rock Car Park.



(C)

The Promenade at Langland Bay from the Beach access at the bottom of Brynfield Road to the entrance to Rotherlade Beach.
The Promenade at the entrance to Caswell Beach and the path running alongside the Beach area.
