


COMMUNITY AREA PROFILE: LLWCHWR

Population: 45,800 (source: mid-2018 rounded estimates, Office for National Statistics / ONS)
Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in the Community Area:
Cockett 5; Gorseinon 1 & 2; Gowerton 1, 2 & 3; Kingsbridge 1, 2 & 3;
Llangyfelach 2 & 3; Lower Loughor; Mawr; Penclawdd 1 & 2; Penllergaer 1 & 2;
Penyrheol 1, 2, 3 & 4; Pontardulais 1, 2, 3 & 4; Upper Loughor 1 & 2

Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea West.



- Location: This area comprises mostly the district centres to the north-west and around the Loughor estuary/river, and the rural north of the county. It consists of 27 LSOAs, and is the second highest populated of the six areas, but has the second lowest density.
- Area Wards: Cockett (part), Gorseinon, Gowerton, Kingsbridge, Llangyfelach (part), Lower Loughor, Mawr, Penclawdd, Penllergaer, Penyrheol, Pontardulais, Upper Loughor
- Area: 13,746 hectares / 137.46 km² (2011 Census)
- Population Density (2018): 333 people per km²
- > **Population Change (2008 to 2018)**: +2,500 / +6% (ONS estimates, rounded)
- Employment: 12,000 (ONS workplace estimate, 2018). Major employers: Swansea Council schools, Gower College Swansea, 3M plc, Toyoda Gosei, Timet UK, industrial estate occupiers (Crofty, Garngoch and Pontardulais), agriculture businesses.



- The age profile of the population in this community area is broadly similar to Swansea's overall, but with slightly higher proportions aged 5-15 and 45-74, and lower proportions aged 16-24
- The area has a higher percentage of people born in Wales (2011 Census), and a higher percentage of people able to speak Welsh than the Swansea average
- Other population characteristics are relatively close to Swansea averages
- The area has a higher percentage of married or civil partnership couples and lower proportions of 'One-person – other' (under 65) and 'Other household' types
- Higher percentages of detached and semi-detached household accommodation. High levels of home ownership (both with mortgage/loan and outright) and below average proportions in private or social rented tenures (2011 Census).



SOCIO-ECONOMIC DATA

 \geq Local estimates of average net annual household income are available via ONS model-based estimates at MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) level for 2015/16. This Community Area contains all or part of seven MSOAs, with figures ranging from £25,300 (Swansea 005, see map) to £31,400 (Swansea 004). The median figure (the middle value of MSOAs in the area) is £28,200 (5% above the Swansea median of £26,900).



NS-SeC data (socio-economic position based on occupation) reports slightly higher than average percentages in all NS-SeC class categories (classes 1-7), but levels in the not classified (full-time students) category are lower than the Swansea average.
