



- Location: Consisting of 19 LSOAs, this area includes the urban areas to the northwest of the city and is adjacent to four of the other five areas. It has the smallest land area but the highest population density of the six community areas.
- Area Wards: Castle (part), Cockett (part), Cwmbwrla, Mynyddbach (part), Penderry
- Area: 922 hectares / 9.22 km² (2011 Census)
- Population Density (2018): 3,529 people per km²
- **Population Change (2008 to 2018)**: +1,600 / +5% (ONS estimates, rounded)
- **Employment**: 7,000 (ONS workplace estimate, 2018). Major employers: Swansea Council (schools and depots), First Cymru, Cwmdu Industrial Estate, Swansea West Industrial Estate (part).



- ➤ The area has a high percentage of people born in Wales (2011 Census)
- > Higher percentage of adults with no qualifications and fewer with higher level qualifications
- > Percentage of people with long-term health problem or disability above the Swansea average
- > Higher proportions of lone parent, 'One person other' and cohabiting couple households
- Higher proportions of terraced and semi-detached accommodation. Lower levels of home ownership, and higher percentage of social rented households, especially rented from Council (2011 Census).



SOCIO-ECONOMIC DATA

Local estimates of average net annual household income are available via ONS model-based estimates at MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) level for 2015/16. This Community Area contains all or part of six MSOAs, with figures ranging from £20,700 (Swansea 016) to £25,400 (Swansea 017, see map). The median figure (the middle value of MSOAs in the area) is £24,050 (11% below the Swansea median of £26,900).



NS-SeC data (socio-economic position based on occupation) indicates a higher than average percentage in routine and manual occupations (NS-SeC classes 5-7) and lower than average levels in managerial and professionals (NS-SeC classes 1-2).
