NOTES FOR GUIDANCE - USE OF PORTABLE TRAFFIC SIGNALS ON THE HIGHWAY

By submitting this application form the applicant acknowledges the following matters, and where relevant agrees to observe and perform the same

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD PORTABLE TRAFFIC SIGNALS BE USED AT WORKS WHICH STRADDLE A RAILWAY LEVEL CROSSING, NOR TO CONTROL ROAD TRAFFIC WITHIN 50 METRES OF A LEVEL CROSSING EQUIPPED WITH TWIN RED TRAFFIC SIGNALS. THE ADVICE OF THE RAILWAY/TRANSPORT AUTHORITY MUST BE SOUGHT AND CONFIRMATION OF APPROVAL WITH THE STREET WORKS SECTION MUST BE MADE PRIOR TO WORK COMMENCING IN THE VICINITY OF RAILWAY CROSSINGS.

1. As required by The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 No. 362, and the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991, the Highway Authority shall be given NOTICE whenever Portable Traffic Signal Control is to be used on the Highway.
2. Where Portable Traffic Signal Control is to be used at a site which contains a JUNCTION, it is a STATUTORY REQUIREMENT for the Highway Authority to issue a WRITTEN SITE APPROVAL for their operation PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT OF USE.
3. Applications for the use of multiphase portable traffic signals on **Trunk Roads** must be approved and authorised by the Welsh Government.
4. For authorisation of multiphase signals on Trunk Roads, a minimum of one month should be allowed for processing, and on County Roads, a minimum of 14 days should be allowed.
5. 7 days' notice is required for two-way signals, unless required under emergency conditions.
6. Where the location contains a junction, the application must be accompanied by FOUR copies of a plan showing the positions of the signal heads, together with details of the proposed timings.
7. The provision, operation and maintenance of all signals, lights, guards and fencing for the safety and protection of street and road works, workers and members of the public will be in accordance with the Traffic Signs Manual, Chapter 8, Safety at Street Works and Road Works, A Code of Practice, appropriate technical directives and advice notes issued by the Highway Authority, Department of Transport and the Welsh Government.
8. All **APPLICATIONS** and **NOTIFICATIONS** for the use of Portable Traffic Signals **MUST** be emailed to the **STREET WORKS SECTION** at streetworks@swansea.gov.uk
9. In **EMERGENCY** or **URGENT** situations (as defined in the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991) this form **MUST** be emailed to the STREET WORKS SECTION at streetworks@swansea.gov.uk & Highways@swansea.gov.uk

10. Welsh Language requirements:

10a. Applicants must be aware of, and shall fully comply with the Welsh Language (Wales) Measure 2011 or any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force and any Welsh Language Standards made thereunder when erecting any traffic signs or conducting any other public communication. 10b. The applicant shall indemnify the Council against any losses including any financial penalty from the Welsh Language Commission, and any liabilities, claims, damages, proceedings, judgments and expenses including without limitation counsel fees, court costs and other legal expenses arising from the applicant's failure to comply with the requirements of clause 10a above.
