NOTICE OF MAKING 2022

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the City and County of Swansea did on 22nd March 2022 make an Experimental Order in pursuance of its powers as contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) under Sections 9 and 10 the effect of such Order is as set out in the Schedules below. The Order will come into effect on 31st March 2022 for a period of 18 months. A copy of the Order, Statement of Reasons and an appropriate plan may be inspected during normal office hours in the Legal, Democratic Services and Business Intelligence at Civic Centre Oystermouth Road Swansea SA1 3SN or alternatively, it can be accessed via <https://www.swansea.gov.uk/article/28709/Experimental-Traffic-Regulation-Orders>. This Order may be made permanent subject to consideration by the Council of any objections. Any objections to the Order should be submitted in writing, setting out the reasons for such objections, to reach the Head of Legal, Democratic Services and Business Intelligence, Civic Centre, Oystermouth, Road, Swansea, SA1 3SN or via email at Legal.TrafficNotices@swansea.gov.uk within six months of the date the order comes into force quoting reference DVT/00265114/AVR

Schedule 1 – Prohibition of driving

- **Cakes and Ale**, 29 Newton Road, commencing at a distance of 15 metres from its junction with Walters Crescent (13.5m x 2m, occupying a total area of 27m²).
- **The Dark Horse**, 510 Mumbles Road, commencing at a distance of 25 metres north west of its junction with Newton Road (7.5m x 2m, occupying a total area of 15m²).
- **Boo's Kitchen**, 2 Woodville Road, commencing at a distance of 1 metre west of its junction with Queen's Road – (12m x 1.6m, occupying a total area of 192m²).
- **The Westbourne**, 1 Brynymor Road, commencing at a distance of 2 metres east of its junction with Phillips Parade – (11m x 10.2m, occupying a total area of 112.2m²).
- **The Brunswick**, 3 Duke Street, commencing at a distance of 18 metres east of junction with Brunswick Street – (9.7m x 2.2m, occupying a total area of 21m²).
- **La Parmigiana & Crazy Baker**, 7/8 Duke Street, commencing at a distance of 8 metres in a north easterly direction from the junction with Caswell Street – (10.5m x 2.1m, occupying a total area of 22.05m²).
- **Crumbs Kitchen**, 2 Gwydr Crescent, commencing at a distance of 10 metres from its junction with Uplands Crescent – (8.5m x 1.8m, occupying a total area of 15.3m²).
- **Pinatas**, 8 Strand, commencing at a distance of 30 metres north of its junction with Quay Parade – (15.9m x 1.8m, occupying a total area of 28.62m²).
- **The Monkey Tree**, 564 Neath Road, commencing at a distance of 60 metres north of its junction with Morris Street – (14.5m x 12.2m, occupying a total area of 176.9m²).

Access for emergency vehicles and pedestrians to be maintained at all times

The maximum duration of the order is 18 months.
