An active travel behaviour change campaign was launched, Swansea Bayways, which provided information to workplaces, members of the public and groups, in order to support uptake and awareness of active travel opportunities. A social media presence was also established, and over 900 people subscribed to receive updates from the campaign. A new cycle network map was developed and 6 large scale maps were placed across the network to signpost users to the off-road network. |
