In accordance with the duties under sections 7 (3) and 10 (2) of the Active Travel (Wales) Act 2013, please find Swansea Council's annual report for the year 2020-21.

The actions taken to promote active travel journeys

Swansea Council continued to maintain its provision for hard and electronic format maps of its active travel network. The maps continue to improve the information provision for the location of available active travel routes across the City & County area. The active travel behaviour change campaign, Swansea Bayways. continued to provide information to workplaces, members of the public and groups, in order to support uptake and awareness of active travel opportunities. Social media content continued to be developed to support active travel messaging, and continued to have over 900 people subscribed to receive updates from the campaign.

A new cycle parking map was developed to signpost users to the cycle parking across the network.

A programme of engagement was developed under the title 'Active Travel Workplace' to work with workplaces to provide information on how best to encourage and support employees to choose active travel for commuting and work based travel.

The Swansea Bayways campaign was also utilised to support the communication of active travel options for local residents during the prolonged periods of coronavirus related lockdowns, when public transport was operating with a reduced timetable and at reduced capacity.
